#### DIRECTIONS:

Bridgewater is located on the southwest corner of Kingston Pike, just off I-40 at exit 379 (Bridgewater Road). This is one exit EAST of Cedar Bluff in West Knoxville.

Traveling east on I-40, exit onto Bridgewater, turn right, cross Kingston Pike and immediately turn right into the parking lot.

Traveling west on I-40, exit at Walker Springs/ Bridgewater. Continue straight on exit ramp and turn left on Bridgewater (3rd light), cross Kingston Pike and turn right into the parking lot.

From Maryville, take the Pellissippi Parkway toward Knoxville, exit onto I-40 East. Exit at 379, Bridgewater and turn right toward Kingston Pike.. Cross Kingston Pike and immediately turn right into our parking lot.

## Bridgewater Speech & Hearing is a provider for:

- Most insurance plans.
- Tennessee Early Intervention Services (TEIS).
- Many public and private school systems in the region for services not provided within the school system. Check with your principal for more information.

Families are cautioned that most insurance carriers in Tennessee do not cover hearing aid services. Bridgewater will provide resources to address the gaps in coverage. In addition, most services covered by insurance require a medical referral prior to scheduling services, usually from the pediatrician, often from the specialist working with you and your child.

No services are billed to the family if another source of reimbursement is available. For example, partnerships for delivering services are developed with the child’s school system. Where possible, the local school can provide services at no cost, and these services are explored by the family.

- Progress is measured during each session.
- Treatment techniques and helpful information are shared with the family to enhance the progress of the child.
- Appointments are provided promptly, scheduled to best serve the needs of the child.
- Reports are distributed to the family and designated providers in a timely manner.
